

2 tr in next st, slst into last st to join. Break yarn and fasten off. Weave in all ends.

8 sts,

Round 2: ch 1, 1 dc into 1st st, 2 dtr into next 5 sts, 2 tr in next st, 1 dc in next st, 2 tr in next st, 2 dtr in next

Slst into ch 1 at start of round to join.

Round 1: Ch 1, 2dc into each tr of previous round.

Using red yarn.

at start of round to join. [10 sts]

Ch 3 (counts as first tr), 9 tr into loop, Slst into 3rd ch

with a slst)

Using black yarn create a magic loop (or ch 4 and join

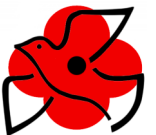
