Instructions

The poppy is worked in four simple continuous rounds. Stitches used: ch: chain. dc: double crochet.

Stitches used: ch: chain, dc: double crochet, htr: half treble crochet, tc: treble crochet, slip stitch

Poppy

Round 1: work 8 dc into a magic circle and pull to close, or ch 5 and join into a circle. Round 2: (dc, 2 dc into next stitch, 3 htr into Round 3: (slst, htr, 2 htr into next stitch, 3 htr into next stitch, 2 htr into next stitch, htr into next stitch) x2 [20].

(lt's round 4 that gives the poppy its small and big petal.)

Round 4: slat into the next two stitches, $\underline{1}$ dc and 2 htr into next stitch, 3 htr into next stitch, 2 htr into the next three stitches, 3 htr into next stitch, 2 htr and $\underline{1}$ dc into next stitch, slat into the next two stitches, $\underline{1}$ htr and 2 tc into next stitch, 3 tc into next stitch, 2 tc into next five stitches, 3 tc into next stitch, 2 tc and $\underline{1}$ htr into next stitches, 3 tc into next stitch, 2 tc and $\underline{1}$ htr into next stitches, 3 tc into next stitch, 2 tc and $\underline{1}$ htr into next stitches, 3 tc into next stitch, 2 tc and $\underline{1}$ htr into next stitches, 3 tc into next stitch.

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4 stitches.

Ch 8, dc in second ch from hook. Work 5 more dc, then work 3 dc into last chain. Do not turn work, but instead rotate the work 180 degrees and work 6 dc down the opposite side of the starting chain,

An 2, tam. Work 1 dc into next stitch then slst into next 4 stitches.

You should end up with something that looks like the picture. Use the yarn ends to stitch to the poppy, positioning it at 11 o'clock if you can.
