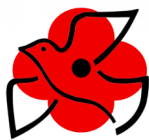


Centre of Poppy  
Sew on a button, make a small black pom-pom or sew on a circle of black felt

Body of Poppy  
Using red yarn cast on 60 st  
Row 1-10 : K2 P2  
Row 11 : K2 tog across the row.  
Row 12 : S1 1 K2 tog pss0 ... repeat across the row.  
Break off yarn with long tail and thread back through remaining stitches and pull tight.  
Join edges with mattress stitch

Scrap of black yarn.
