

Break yarn and finish off ends.
 N.B. You could make this poppy using only red and add a black button or small round of black felt to finish.

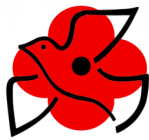
Round 1: Using Red yarn. Ch 1, 2dc into each tr of previous round. Slst into ch 1 at start of round [20 sts]
 Round 2: ch 1* [1 tr, 1dtr] into first st, 2 dtr into next 3 sts, [1 dtr, 1tr 1 dc] into next st. Repeat from * 3 more times. Slst into ch 1 at start of round to join.

Petals

Using Black yarn, create a magic loop (or chain 4 and join with a slst.)
 Ch 3 (counts as first tr.) 9 tr into loop
 Slst into 3rd ch at start of round to join. [10 sts]
 Fasten off.

Centre of poppy,

Abbreviations
 Slst = Slip stitch,
 Ch = chain,
 Dc = double crochet,
 Tr = treble crochet,
 Dtr = double crochet

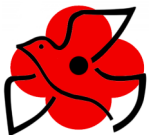
